

FDA Approves New Roche Drug Kadcylla for Breast Cancer

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The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has approved Kadcylla (ado-trastuzumab emtansine), a new drug to treat breast cancer patients, Reuters reports. Created by Swiss drugmaker Roche Holding AG, the drug is for patients in the late stages of metastatic breast cancer who have failed to respond to other therapies. Kadcylla is approved for patients whose cancer cells have increased levels of a protein known as HER2. The first armed antibody approved to treat a solid tumor, Kadcylla will cost \$9,800 a month. The box label contains a warning for the potential of liver and heart damage, life-threatening birth defects and death, but the most common side effects are nausea, fatigue, muscle and joint pain, increased liver enzymes, headache and constipation.
