

Lil Nas X's Baby Registry Raises Funds for HIV Nonprofits

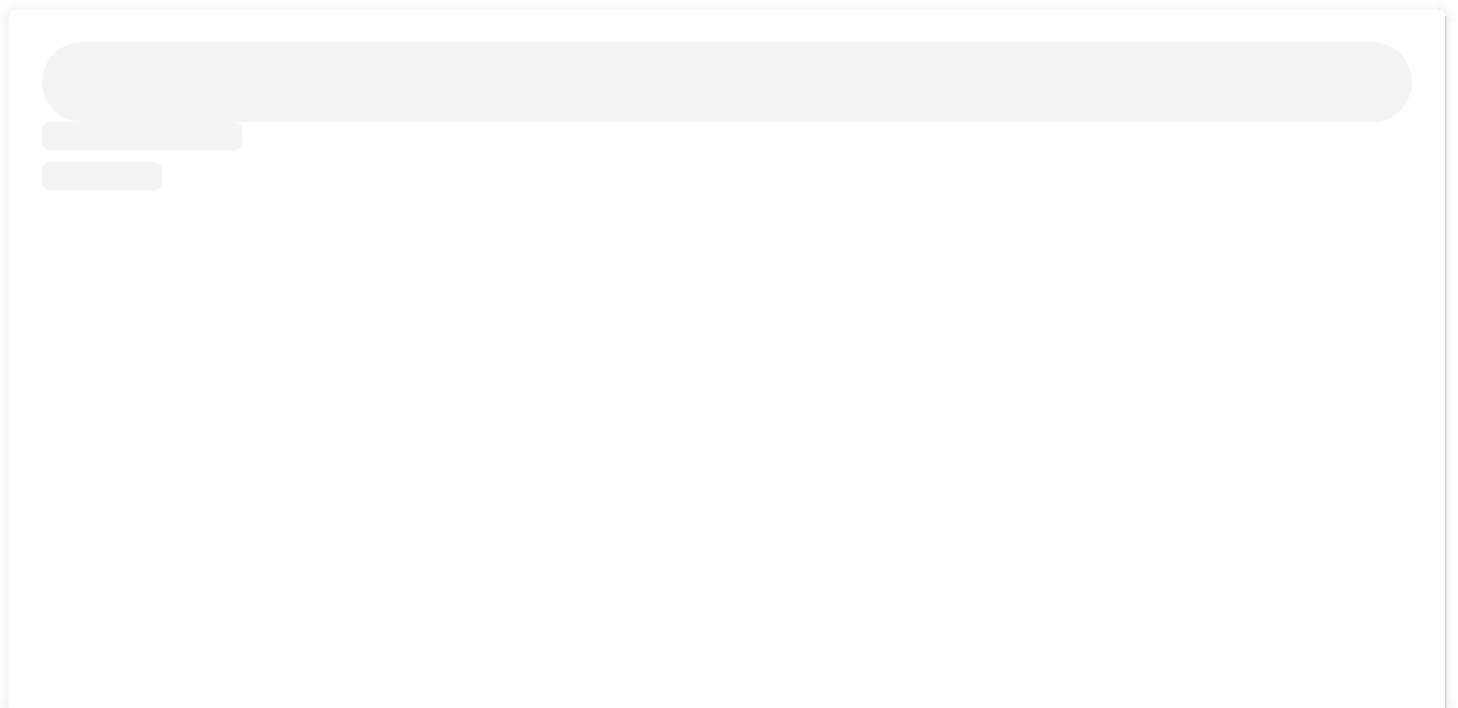
At the VMAs, Lil Nas X nodded to Southern folks living with HIV. Days later, the pop star gave birth to “Montero,” his debut album.

Alert the stork! Lil Nas X is about to give birth. The arrival date for his debut album, *Montero*, is Friday, September 15. In keeping with the pregnancy theme, the marketing-savvy [celebrity](#) launched an online “baby registry” for his expected little one. The registry invites fans to donate to nonprofits that address [HIV/AIDS](#) in [the South](#).

The registry—[on WelcomeToMontero.com](#)—lists a different nonprofit with each track on his upcoming album. With the exception of The Bail Project, a national group fighting to end cash bail, and the Cade Foundation, which supports families experiencing infertility, the nonprofits listed in the registry are part of [Gilead Sciences' COMPASS Initiative](#), which combats HIV/AIDS in the South.

Lil Nas X gave people living with HIV in the South a shout-out when he performed his recent hits “Industry Baby” and “Montero (Call Me By Your Name)” at Sunday’s Video Music Awards (VMAs). Featured in the performance was Madrequis Harris, the director of community investments at the [Southern AIDS Coalition](#), who wore a black shirt with a coded HIV-related message.





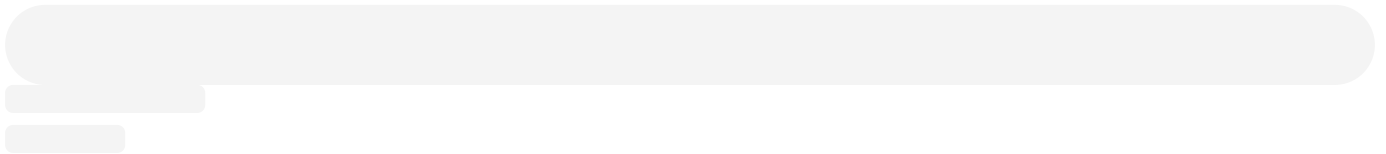

The [LGBTQ](#) advocacy group GLAAD explained it via Instagram: “[@lilnasx](#) delivered a powerful performance at the [#VMAs](#) and shined a spotlight on the stigma that fuels HIV, especially across the South. Mardrequis Harris from [@southernaidscoalition](#) wore the number 433,816 in red, representing the number of people living with HIV in the U.S. South.”

What’s more, Billy Porter, who starred in Broadway’s Kinky Boots and, more recently, in the HIV-themed TV series Pose and who [publicly disclosed his status in May](#), introduced the rapper’s performance.

“When I was first coming up in this industry,” Porter told the VMA audience, “let me just say that people were not ready for all this Black boy joy. But children, it’s a new day, and I am so thankful to have witnessed it.”

Lil Nas took home the coveted VMA Moon Person trophy for video of the year for “Montero (Call Me by Your Name),” beginning his speech with “Thank you to the gay agenda.”

This isn't Lil Nas X's first time at the rodeo. He became world-famous with his smash country-rap single "Old Town Road," one of the best-selling singles of all time, and he has shown a Madonna-like knack for garnering headlines.

And now he's shining a light on nonprofits associated with Gilead Sciences' COMPASS Initiative (the name stands for "COMmitment to Partnership in Addressing HIV/AIDS in Southern States"). Gilead manufactures several leading HIV medications.

To celebrate the "birth" of [@LilNasX](#)'s album "Montero," he released a baby registry including Southern community organizations that are a part of the Gilead COMPASS Initiative®.

The tweet above, by Gilead COMPASS Initiative, lists the nonprofits associated with the Lil Nas X's baby registry. However, the Montero baby registry lists and describes a slightly different list; they include:

Transinclusive Group
