

Meet the 30 Groups Awarded Over \$2M to Fight HIV in the South [VIDEO]

Gilead Sciences' COMPASS Initiative funds the Transformative Grants to bolster HIV groups in the South.

Gilead Sciences' COMPASS Initiative awarded a total of nearly \$2.2 million in Transformative Grants to 30 U.S. organizations fighting [HIV](#) in the [South](#). Grantees are listed below and in the video above.

Considered the epicenter of the HIV epidemic in the United States, [the South accounts for 52% of new diagnoses](#), according to federal data cited by [Gilead Sciences](#), which manufactures several blockbuster HIV medications.

This marks the fifth year of Transformative Grants from COMPASS—the name stands for “COMmitment to Partnership in Addressing HIV/AIDS in Southern States.” The grantees are chosen by the COMPASS Coordinating Centers: Emory University Rollins School of Public Health, Southern AIDS Coalition, University of Houston Graduate College of Social Work and Wake Forest University School of Divinity.

“Our Transformative Grant partners are not only providing lifesaving essential support to people impacted by HIV but are also building valuable community programs, addressing harmful stigma and partnering with faith-based organizations to truly change lives,” Kia Colbert, director of the COMPASS Coordinating Center at Emory University, said in the release.
