

National HIV Testing Day 2016

June 24, 2016

Monday, June 27, marks National HIV Testing Day ([NHTD](#)) 2016, an event established by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to promote HIV testing.

The CDC's [Act Against AIDS](#) campaign offers five things you can do to observe NHTD:

1. Read up on the facts: Learn the basics about HIV testing.
 2. Get tested and encourage others to do the same. The CDC campaign "[Doing It](#)" offers testing resources and locations. To find a testing site near you, text your ZIP code to "KNOW IT" (566948).
 3. Join the CDC and Act Against AIDS on social media, download their sharable images and use hashtag #NHTD when you promote the event on your own social media.
 4. Regardless of your HIV status, you can spread the word about the CDC's testing campaigns, particularly #DoingIt.
