

World Hepatitis Day 2026

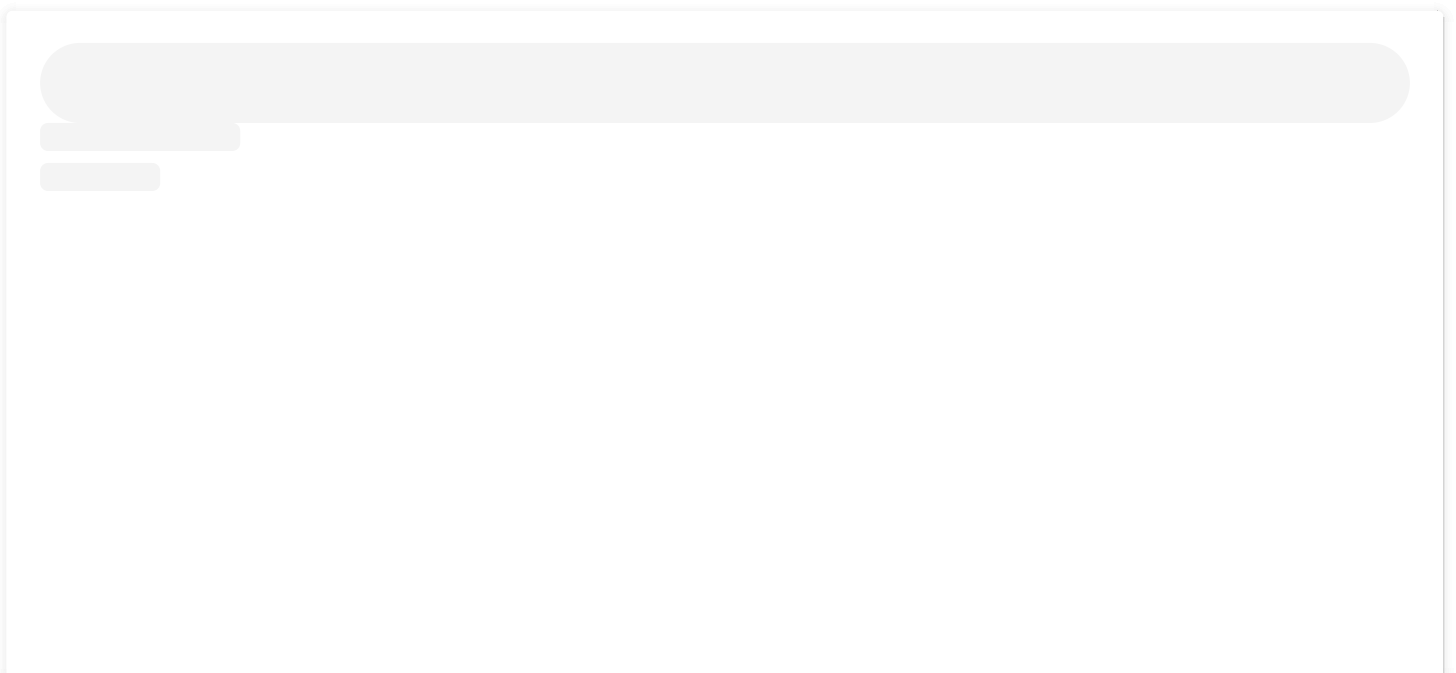
This year's theme, "Hepatitis: Let's Break It Down," calls for the removal of barriers that stand between people and the services that can save their lives.

Tuesday, July 28, marks [World Hepatitis Day](#) 2026, a day organized by the [World Health Organization \(WHO\)](#) to raise awareness of [viral hepatitis](#), an [inflammation](#) of the liver that causes severe [liver disease](#) and [liver cancer](#).

This year's theme, "Hepatitis: Let's Break It Down," calls for turning science into action with five key messages:

- Leverage existing science and [policies](#);
- Put people and communities at the center of hepatitis elimination;
- Ensure equitable [access](#) to hepatitis services for all;
- Integrate hepatitis services into universal health coverage;
- Accelerate [research](#) and innovation.





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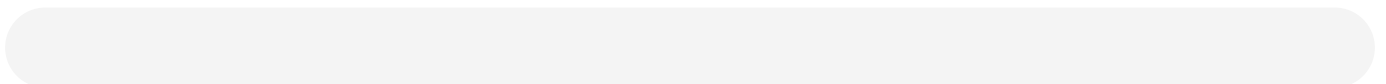
The second-largest organ in the human body after the skin, the [liver](#) plays an essential role in the body's filtration system, removing [toxins](#) and waste products from the bloodstream and storing important nutrients, like vitamins and minerals.

Viral hepatitis attacks the liver; when left untreated, it can lead to scarring of the liver ([cirrhosis](#)), liver cancer, the need for a [liver transplant](#) and death.

Hepatitis can be caused by several factors, including toxins, excess alcohol use, autoimmune diseases, fat in the liver and viruses, including the three most common ones: [hepatitis A](#), [B](#) and [C](#). (The other two main strains are [D](#) and [E](#).)

The WHO estimates that [1.34 million people](#) worldwide died of chronic viral hepatitis B (HBV) and C (HCV) in 2024. That same year, approximately 1.8 million new infections (over 4,900 daily) were diagnosed.

Effective vaccines are available for hep A and [B](#). HCV is curable in most cases; however, HBV is not.





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The global awareness day is observed on July 28 in honor of Nobel Prize-winning scientist and global health advocate Baruch S. Blumberg, MD, PhD, who in 1967 discovered the HBV and developed a diagnostic test and vaccine for the virus.

“We’re extremely proud that the [Hepatitis B Foundation](#) has been able to grow our hepatitis delta and liver cancer programs and expand our global reach in recent years, and our new mission statement reflects that progress,” said Hepatitis B Foundation president Chari A. Cohen, DrPH, MPH, [in a press release](#).

For World Hepatitis Day, the Hepatitis B foundation is introducing 22 new stories in its [Just B storytelling program](#) to highlight the humans behind hepatitis B and liver cancer as well as a new set of [videos about the role of the hepatitis B vaccine in protecting babies from infection](#). The Hepatitis B Foundation also launched a new mission statement, logo and tagline to better reflect the organization’s work in liver disease broadly: “A World Free of Hepatitis B, Hepatitis D and Liver Cancer.”



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
